Important note:

In most cases the spelling errors are actually as printed in the actual copy of the minutes. I left them this way as to reflect on how things were in the past which is why I have used “ ” marks with the minutes. Some secretaries wrote the minutes in cursive or in pencil which have either faded or were hard to read. I hope I put these down correctly. The original copy is in the archives for those interested.

Some of the sessions were missing and are noted as such. If comments were added by myself they will be in (small type in parentheses). Also a large gap in the years will be missing from November 1962 thru September 1976. Hope we can locate them someday.

Not much is known of the early days of the club dating back to 1933 and no minutes have been found as of the time of this record.

The bank balances are cleaned up but are listed for what was written down.

As Vice President and Newsletter Editor of what is now called the Intercity Amateur Radio Club or IARC, I enjoyed rewriting these records. The history of our club is quite interesting and has seen some good and bad times. At one point there had been talk of disbanding the club. Thankfully the members got things back together and as we all know the club still lives!!

Family picnics, fishing trips, field day, the annual auction which predated the annual hamfest, Civil Defence which is now covered by ARES® and RACES are just a few things found in these pages. I hope all who read these pages enjoy the history of the IRC/IARC.

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April 7, 1944

“The meeting was called to order by our President Egon Loeckel. There was very little new on mers. The minutes of the last meeting was read and approved. There was a fine talk and demonstration on audio osc. By Mr.Crum after witch the meeting was adjourned and the wimen served the eats.” **signed by Tony Miller**

Club's account – old balance = \$30.97 – expenses and additions \$2.50 for new member's dues & Spent \$4.78 for meeting hall rent and eats. Of the member dues \$2.00 was sent to the ARRL for QST and 50¢ was put in the account for a new balance of \$28.19

New member was A.Hunter (*no call sign given*)



May 5, 1944

“The regular meeting of the IRC was called to order by Pres. Egon Loeckel. The minutes of the last meeting was read an approved. There was no old bussiness. Under new bussiness WERS and our activities was discussed. Then there was a swell talk on VHF frequency ants. By Egon Loeckel after witch eats was served and adjournment” **signed by Tony Miller**

Club's Account – Old Balance \$28.19 – Expenses And additions \$4.84 for hall rent and eats, With door fees adding \$2.25 which as written was \$2.59 “in the hole witch will be taken out of club treasure” Leving a new balance of \$25.60



June 2, 1944

“The IRC meeting was opened by our Pres. Egon Loeckel. The minutes and roll call was read and approved. There was no old bussiness. Under new bussiness it was approved to close meetings for the summer months. The meeting was adjourned and turned over to Al Biddle who gave a very fine talk on the beginnings mathematics & the great pyramid” **signed by Tony Miller**

Club's Account – Old balance \$25.60 – expenses and additions - \$4.32 for hall rent & eats, \$1.00 for post cards, which left a balance of 20.28 add the \$1.50 for dues & door fees which added \$3.75 then balanced at \$25.53 with additional expense of \$1.18 for envelopes & stamps. New Bal = \$24.35

\$7.50 was taken in for QST & club dues. The members were Roland Burson, M.J. Willacker, & Floyd Myers. \$6.00 was sent to ARRL for QST and \$1.50 went to the club

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There were no minutes for September or October 1944
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November 3, 1944

“The meeting was called to order by our Pres. Egon Loeckel. Minutes of the last read and approved. Then there was a round discussion of what what the fellows were doing thru out the summer month. Then the meeting was turned over to Mr D. R. Tashjian who gave a very fine talk on super regenerative rcvrs. After that the meeting was adjourned so we could get the eats”

Club Account – Old Balance \$24.35 – Expenses and additions = Eats & hall rent \$4.94 Door fees added \$4.75 which left the balance at \$24.16. QST & Dues were a total of \$15.00 with \$12.00 going to ARRL for the QSTs and \$3.00 to the club final new balance of \$33.66

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There were no minutes for December 1944 thru February 1945
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March 2, 1945

“The meeting was called to order by our pres. Egon Loeckel. The minutes of the last meeting was read & approved. There was no old bussiness and under new bussiness, the new radio aid. Egon Loeckel outlined the new operating procedure & the freq. Allocation. The meeting was adjourned & the door price was drawn. B. Stotts got the first price a fine rcvr cabinet. Second price went to G rehl & third price to G Ling & so forth.”

Club Account – Old Balance \$33.66 – Additions & expenses = Door fees took in \$7.00 then hall rent and prices took \$7.00 with another \$2.00 for 200 postcards which left \$31.66. Club dues added 3.50 for a new balance of \$35.16

7 members signed up for QST which was \$14.00 for the ARRL plus the balance of \$3.50 for dues.

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No minutes for April 1945
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May 4, 1945

“The meeting was called to order by our Pres Egon Loeckel. The minutes of the last meeting was read and approved. Next we had a roll call at which time each member was asked about his activities. No old business or new business. The meeting was turned over to Al Biddle who gave a swell talk on the beginning of time. After that we then adjourned for coffee and donuts that were served by the ladies”

Club Account – Old Balance \$35.16 – Expenses and additions = Eats were \$7.26 and hall rent was \$2.00 which deducted \$9.26 making the balance at \$25.90 then door fees added \$7.50 and dues added \$4.00 putting the balance at \$37.40 with \$1.97 for envelopes with the total new balance at \$35.43

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There were no minutes for September 1945 thru November 1945
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December 7, 1945

“The meeting was called to order by our Pres Egon Loeckel. The minutes of the last meeting read and approved. Roll call was called & each member gave some description of his activities. No new business & no old business. We next went to election of officers. Our new Pres is Adam Holtzmilller W8GFB and Vice Pres Egon Loeckel W8TAJ. For Sec & Treasurer Jimmy Anderson W8TIH. After which time the door prizes was given a way & last but not least coffee and donuts”

Club account – Old Balance \$35.43 – Additions & expenses = Coffee & donuts were \$2.40 and hall rent & door prizes were \$12.25 giving a balance at \$20.78. Door fees brought in \$8.00 and dues & QST added \$15.50 which balanced at \$44.28 and additional \$2.50 brought the new balance to 49.28. Those listed as paying dues were RJ Mitchell, Harold Sharrock, Harly B Hurshner, William Shurance, Adam Holtzmilller, Floyd Gilmore, Howard Gilmore, C Zents, & Hobart G Cassel.

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January 4, 1946

“The meeting was called to order by our President Egon Loeckel. The minutes of the last meeting of Dec. 7 was read and approved. Each member gave a good account of himself and his actions on radio. The club at this time placed the new officers. W8GFB Adam Holtzmilller as President, W8TAJ Egon Loeckel as vice president, and W8TIH James R Anderson as secretary and treasury. An interesting talk was given on modulation by Mr H Harding W9IYN. At the conclusion the meeting was adjourned and the boys retired to the kitchen for coffee and doughnuts.” **Signed by James Robert Anderson and approved by RAH**

Door prize was won by Jack Barr W8VTP.

February 1 1946

“The meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes of the last meeting of Jan 4 were read and approved. Each member gave a good account of himself and his activities. Jack Barr was appointed as master of arms. Herbert Garnes as public relations manager. The club's constitution was up for modification pertaining to dues and membership. The motion was made by A.R.Miller and seconded by G Lingafelter. An interesting talk and drawing of harmonic occilator was given by F. Taylor. Egon Loeckel gave a talk on modulation. Then prizes were drawn not forgetting to mention that the club presented Ed Shaw W8FQY of Shelby Ohio with a book how to become a radio amateur. The meeting was adjourned and a good rag chew was held over coffee and doughnuts.”

March 1, 1946

“The meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Each member gave an account of himself and his activities. At this time a contest was announced to our members for the state of Washington contacts which expired March 31st. There was a very interesting demonstrative talk given on beam antennas by Robert Fry Mt Vernon Ohio. The meeting was adjourned. The boys helped themselves to sloppy joes.”

April 5, 1946

“The meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes and treasurers reports of the last meeting were read and approved. Old bussiness and new bussiness was discussed in general. At this time Mr Earl Hoover gave a demonstrative talk on meters and when to use them. At this time the motion was made that the meeting be adjourned. The boys retired to the kitchen for coffee and doughnuts”

May 3, 1946

“The meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes and treasury reports of the last meeting were read and approved. A demonsrative talk was given by Professor Guiley of Ashland Ohio on frequency and calibration. The field day committee Harold Sharrock, and Jake Erndt gave reports on prospective locations for field day activities on June 22 and 23. Nine members were initiated as members of the IRC by the initiation Committee Edward Shaw, Jake Erndt, & Harold Sharrock, J R Anderson. Motion was made the meeting be adjourned and second by the chair. The members then relaxed for a good rag chew over coffee and doughnuts”.

June 7, 1946

“The meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes and treasury report were read and approved. Egon Loeckel told of his supposedly of repossing the WERS gear. The field day committee gave their final report on location which was held at Ashland County Fairground Ashland Ohio. The motion was made to continue the meeting thru the summer months and the motion was made that the meeting be adjourned. The boys retired to the kitchen for a good rag chew over coffee and doughnuts. PS we had some damn good arguments.”

“The meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes and treasury report were read and approved. The ARRL bulletins and news reports were read and discussed. The letter from DARA was read and lengthly discussion was had. The motion was made that the secretary send a letter stating that the IRC felt that they should leave matters as present condition. Prizes were drawn and won by Ronald Burson, & Harley Hershner. The motion was made to adjourn and the fellows retired to their local contact & coffee & doughnuts”

August 2, 1946

The Meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes and treasury report were read and approved. The ARRL bulletins and news reports were read and discussed. A discussing of starting a code class for beginners and traffic handling brought favorable results. Details and facilities are in the hands of the committee. A short bussiness meeting was held. In conclusion the boys retired for local QRM. The coffee and doughnuts were then served.”

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October 5, 1946

The meeting was called to order by our president Adam Holtzmilller. The minutes of our last meeting were read and approved. Due to absence of our secatery, W8TIH, treasury report and minutes will be read. Roll was called by the president with the gang giving an account of their activities of the past month. Prizes were given to W8WXV & W8PIH for high place winner in the get acquainted party contest. W8TAJ has obtained all the TR 4's and turned them over to W8FQY for use in the EC set up. W8DQA stated that W8FQY is working to get the EC set up under way. And have a report to the next meeting. W8TIH is to follow through and see why W8FQY has not received his EC certificate. A splendid speech was given by Val Isham on the Aurora Borealis. W8ALC gave a demonstration on the use of proper metals in assembling a beam antenna.”

Year end balance on the books was at \$31.75

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December 6,1946

“The meeting was called to order by the President, the roll was called of all present, to give an account of their radio activity for the past month.
Due to the absense of the Secy & Treas., the minutes and treasurers report were not given. Nominations and election of officers was held with the following results. Floyd Myers W8TTS will be the coming President, with Forrest Dickman, W8ALC as Vice President. The Secy& Treas. Duties will be taken by Dick Mitchell W8WYN. The new officers will be installed at the meeting Jan 3, 1947
A discussion was held on bootlegging in the area, with the club taking the stand it would expose any person following the art of ham radio illegally. One person was exposed, with the club to notify the FCC of this operation.
Ronald Burson W8WXV gave a splendid talk on preselectors for the high frequencies and pointed out various points to watch in constructing a preselector.
The sweepstakes contest winner was announced who was R. Burson with a total of 42,000 points for 25 hours of operating.
Meeting was adjourned and coffee and donuts were served and an old fashioned rag chew was had by all.

January 3, 1947

“The meeting was called to order by our President Adam Holtzmilller, the minutes of the previous meeting and the treasurer's report was read by Egan Loeckel, acting secretary, and approved.

The President then appointed Dick Delong W8EMK as installing officer, who in turn appointed Jack Barr W8VTP, as Sergeant-at-arms. Using the Installation Ceremony first used at Crestline in January 1936, they proceeded to instll the following officers. Floyd Myers, W8TTS as President, Forrest Dickman, W8ALC as Vice-President, and R.J. Mitchell W8WYN as Secretary and Treasurer. After the installation, our new President, Floyd Myers, thanked the new past officers for the splendid work they had done during the past year, and the club gave them a nice round of applause for the job well done. Our President then appointed W8LYQ as Sergeant -at-arms. Dick Delong, W8EMK, then gave a very interesting talk on the origin of the Intercity Radio Club, stating that it was organized at the residence of W8PO, in Shelby Ohio in June of 1933.

Door prizes were then drawn, and were won by Dick Delong, Ed Harry, Harold Sharrock, and Jack & Jim Hire.

A short discussion was held on operating courtesy, and the club resolved to try and follow the ARRL's recommendations on this point.

The meeting was then adjourned, and a good rag chew was had by all over the coffee and donuts.

February 8, 1947

“ The February meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our president Floyd Myers W8TTS. The minutes and treasurers report were read by the secretary and approved. Official bulletins No. 73,74, and 75 from ARRL headquarters were read to the members and discussed.

Each member then gave an interesting account of his activities for the past month, when answering the roll call.

The meeting was then turned over to Cloice Proctor W8PMD who gave a very interesting talk on transmission lines and standing waves. After his talk he answered questions from the group and a very interesting discussion was had by all present.

W8JJM reported that he had had a visitor from New York W2MIO who had been bllind from birth, and would be interested in contacting any and all amateurs in this area.

The door prizes were then drawn which went to W8PIH, W8ZET, W8ZES, & Barry Brubaker. The meeting was then adjourned and a good rag chew was had by all over coffee and donuts.”

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March 7, 1947

“The March meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our president W8TTS. The minutes and treasurer's report were read and approved. The secretary then read ARRL bulletins no. 76, 77, 78, and 79, and the club discussed them.

The roll was then called, and each member answered the roll by giving an account of his activities for the last month.

An emergency network was then discussed and on a motion by W8TAJ, Seconded by W8GFB the secretary was ordered to write a letter to the SCM, advising him of the inactivity of our present EC, and request advise as to the proper procedure for appointing a new EC.

A discussion was then held on illegal operation, and on a motion by W8TAJ seconded by W8WPF, the secretary was ordered to answer the letter from the FCC, and give them the new information that was presented to the club.

The door prizes were then drawn, which were won by W8GFB, W8WPF, W8KUU, W8JWT, W8TTS, W8ZXT, and W8VTP.

After the door prizes were drawn, a motion was made to adjourn, after which the group retired to the kitchen, and enjoyed a good rag chew over coffee and donuts.”

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April 4, 1947

“The April meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our Vice President W8ALC, in the absense of our president, W8TTS.

The first in order was the reading of the minutes of then previous meeting and also the treasurer's report, which were read and approved. The secretary then read ARRL bulletins No. 80, 81, and 82.

Ed Shaw W8FQY, then gave a brief talk on the duties of the EC, and asked to be relieved of the duties, on account of work. He agreed to take care of the duties of EC in Shelby, but asked that another man be appointed, to represent the club, and be stationed in Mansfield. On a motion by LYQ, seconded by GFB, it was agreed to appoint one man to the position of EC. On a motion by WPF, seconded by FQY, Egon Loeckel was nominated, and on a motion by GFB, seconded by WPF, James Anderson was nominated.

On a motion by PIH, seconded by VTP, nominations were closed. On a standing vote, James Anderson was elected EC, and the secretary was ordered to send a letter to Dana Cartwright, W8UPB, asking for an appointment.

On a motion by GFB, seconded by WPF, it was agreed to send flowers to W8JJM, who is in the hospital.

The roll was called, and each member gave an interesting account of his activities for the past month.

W8JWT, Fred Rosentreter then gave a very interesting talk on scopes, and their use in amateur radio.

Door prizes were awarded to TIH, IST, Floyd Bookwalter, ZJY, C. Whiteside, AFU, and FQY. A motion was made to adjourn, after which the gang enjoyed a good rag chew over coffee and donuts.”

May 2, 1947

“The May meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our president, W8TTS. The first in order was the reading of the minutes and treasurer's report, which were read and approved. The secretary then read ARRL bulletins No. 83, 84, 85, and 86.

W8TIH then gave a short talk on the purpose of field day, and asked that as many as possible have emergency gear ready for June 14 and 15.

LYQ made a motion, which was seconded by ALC that a field day committee be appointed, and have full charge of the field day, and be ready to make an announcement at the meeting in June.

TIH was appointed chairman of the field day committee, and he appointed the following assistants, VTP, PIH, TAJ, GFB, WPF, and WYN.

GFB made a motion, which was seconded by TAJ, that the club donate \$10.00 to the field day committee, to help them along, and if any profit was made, it was to go to the treasury.

GFB made a motion, which was seconded by TIH, to send flowers to any member of the club, who was in the hospital.

Each member present then gave an account of his activities of the past month, when answering roll call, after which the door prizes were given to YCV, VYH, VBF, Leslie Meclen and John Hriesik.

A motion was made to adjourn, after which the gang enjoyed a good rag chew over coffee and donuts”

June 6, 1947

“The June meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our president, W8TTS. The first in order was the reading of the minutes and the treasurer's report, which was read by ALC in the absense of the secretary. ALC then read ARRL bulletins No. 88, 89 90, and 91. W8TIH then gave a brief talk on the plans that had been made for field day, and asked the cooperation of the group, in making it a record event.

Each member gave an account of his activities of the past month, when answering roll call, after which the door prizes were awarded to TIH, VTP, ISM, ALC, WXV, and KMU.

A motion was made to adjourn, after which the gang enjoyed a good rag chew over coffee and donuts”.

July 11, 1947

“The July meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our president W8TTS. The first in order was the reading of the minutes and the treasurer's report, which were approved as read.

The secretary they read ARRL bulletens No. 92, 93, 94, 95, and 96, and the group discussed them.

Jim Anderson W8TIH then gave a report on the field day, and turned over \$13.00 to the club, which was a profit of \$3.00, as the club had given the field day committee \$10.00 to help them out. TIH gave a short report on the activities at the field day, and the event was considered a success, considering the weather etc.

Jim Anderson W8TIH then asked to be relieved of the EC position, in as much as there seems to have been a mix up in the appointments at headquarters. The secretary was asked to write a letter to the SCM, to try to get it straightened out for the August meeting.

The roll call was then called, and members each gave an account of their activities of the past month, when answering.

Door prizes were then drawn and went to ZET, TIH, Carl Burkett, ZJZ, Emery Stauffer, and Bob Butterfield. A motion was then made by GFB and seconded by TIH to adjourn, after which the gang enjoyed a good rag chew over coffee and cookies.”

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August 1, 1947

“The August meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our president W8TTS. The first in order was the reading of the minutes and the treasurer's report, which were approved as read.

The secretary then read ARRL bulletins No. 97, 98, 99, and 100. And a lengthy discussion was held on them.

The secretary then read two letters that had been received from D E Cartwright SEC which clarified the position of Jim Anderson as EC for this district.

The roll call was then called, and all answered with a report of their activities the past month, after which door prizes were drawn. The prizes went to GFB, Mecklin Butterfield, WYN, YAU, OUZ, VTP, Rhodebeck, and ALC.

A motion was made to adjourn, after which the gang enjoyed a good rag chew over coffee and donuts.”

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September 5, 1947

“The September meeting of the Intercity Radio Club was called to order by our Vice President W8ALC, in the absense of the president. The first in order was the reading of the minutes and treasurer's report, which were approved as read.

The secretary then read ARRL bulletins No. 101,102,103, and 104. These bulletins were then discussed and the members made note of the changes.

- 1) A general description of basic amateur radio receivers, covering the various functions such as the RF amplifier, mixer, IF, detector, and audio circuitry; explaining some of the pros and cons, as well as what is available in our present day commercial equipment in the lines of receivers and the various features that they specify and what they mean to amateur communications.
2. A description of the various circuits used in radio transmitters, such as the oscillator, buffers, finals; how modulation is applied by AM and SSB, also CW operation. This to be followed by an outline covering the type of commercial equipment presently available on the market illustrating the pros and cons of these units.
3. A general outline of the different types of antennas that can be used in this field, covering somewhat in detail the construction and tuning procedure for the various types. All of these subjects should be kept somewhat at a low level so that the most benefit can be derived by the newer hams.
